Miller Analogies Test (MAT)

The MAT is a high level mental ability test requiring the solution of 120 partial analogies in 60 minutes. The MAT is intended to measure the ability to recognize relationships between ideas, fluency in the English language, and general knowledge of the humanities, natural sciences, mathematics, and social sciences. A \$70 fee is required at the time of registration. This registration fee is non-refundable and non-transferable. Test appointments must be made online at http://tpg.tamucc.edu/C20207_ustores/web/store_cat.jsp?STOREID=1&CATID=4.

On the day of the test, the candidate reports to the Student Services Center (SSC) room 210 and presents two forms of personal identification. The primary form of identification must be current and contain the candidate's photo and signature. **Acceptable forms of primary identification include:** driver's license, school identification card, government-issued identification card or passport. **Acceptable forms of secondary identification include:** credit card (with or without a photograph), library card, or utility bill with the candidate's name and address appearing exactly the same as on the primary form of ID. Electronic devices, calculators, and any type of reference aides are not permitted in the testing room.

An examinee will be issued a preliminary score report. Up to three official score reports will be mailed by Pearson to designated institutions in approximately two to three weeks as part of the fee. Institutions that you are applying should be contacted with regard to information regarding a passing score.

Candidates that wish to retake the MAT must be sure to provide their retest admission ticket if the exam was completed within the past 12 months. This is a MAT policy. If an examinee retaking the MAT is administered the same form more than once in a twelve-month period, the examinee's retest score will be voided and will not be reported to any institution.
